Your Connection to the City of Corona

Free QR Code Stickers With Your Medical Profile

Corona Residents, you can now pick up FREE Quick Response (QR) code sticker packs and link your medical profiles. This helps Corona Firefighters access your medical profile as well as your assigned emergency contacts if you or a loved one are ever in an emergency situation.



QR codes are scannable with any smartphone and can give firefighters instant access to your MyID medical profile. To take advantage of this helpful program, pick up your personal QR code sticker packs at any Corona Fire Station or Corona Fire Headquarters. Each kit comes with 4 vinyl stickers, all with the same ID and PIN to be used to access one profile. Then, go to www.GetMyID.com and click on Sign Up to create a MyID profile. MyID is an online medical profile that can be accessed anywhere. Many use it to manage personal medical information and clearly communicate important information to health care providers. MyID profiles are free, and you can add as many profiles as you want. Make an account for yourself, your senior parents, and/or your children. Finally, use the ID and PIN found on your stickers to link your personal stickers to your MyID profile.

Here are some ideas as to where you can put your personal QR stickers:

- Place them on your bike, skateboard, or skates
- Stick them on your child's helmet, or car seat
- Post it on your wallet, phone, or your fridge
- Stick them to your parent's watch or key chain

Fats, Oils And Grease – FOG

Did you know that fats, oils and grease (also known as FOG) that are washed down the drain can cause a blockage in the sewer system which can result in overflows? These spills can potentially be harmful to our health, damage our homes, pollute our local waterways and groundwater, and harm fish and wildlife habitats.

What is FOG?

FOGs are a byproduct of cooking and come from animal and vegetable fats, lard, oil, shortening, butter, margarine, food scraps, sauces and dairy products. FOG in liquid form might not appear harmful, but as they cool, they thicken and harden, sticking to the inside of drainage pipes which reduces the wastewater flow, narrowing the path for water to travel through. The build-up could lead to system failure and results in spills that include raw sewage overflowing into homes, yards, streets and parks.



To dispose of FOG properly, follow these simple steps:

- Never pour FOG into your sink or toilet.
- Pour FOG into a can or jar – coffee cans or pickle jars work well!
- Place a lid on the top of the can or jar and store it until it is full. When the can is full, throw it away in the trash.
- When there is FOG residue in a pan or dish, wipe it away with a paper towel and throw it in the trash before washing the pan or dish.
- Place a strainer in the kitchen sink drain to catch food scraps and other solids; empty the strainer into the trash.


GARAGE & YARD SALE REQUIREMENTS

Did you know a permit is required in order to conduct a garage or yard sale in Corona? The City allows only three (3) sales per year per applicant or location. Display of sale items should not block the sidewalk, parkway, or any area within the public right-of-way, as this could be a health and safety hazard. No more than two signs are allowed on the sale premises, and no more than two additional signs off premises. Be sure to get permission from the property owners where signs are placed. Do not place signs on utility poles, light poles, utility boxes, stop signs, or mail boxes, and don't forget to remove your signs after. Failure to do so may result in a citation. When applying for a permit, be sure to list the personal items that you will be selling and post your permit on the premises of the sale while in progress. You can purchase a permit in person by visiting City Hall (400 S. Vicentia Ave.) or online by visiting www.DiscoverCorona.com. To report an illegal garage sale after hours or on weekends or holidays, please contact the Police Department at (951) 736-2330. Good luck with your sale!



CORONA MILITARY BANNER PROGRAM

The City's Military Banner program recognizes and honors Corona residents and their immediate family members (spouse, child, parent, legal guardian, or sibling) who are serving on active duty in the United States Armed Forces. For the purpose of this program, active duty is defined as 12 months of continuous service. To participate in the program, download and complete the application from the City's website at www.DiscoverCorona.com. Please be sure to include proof of residency such as a current utility bill or driver's license listing a Corona address. Banners can be designed with the serviceperson's picture or without it and are installed twice a year in May and November along Main and Sixth Street.

HAVE YOU HEARD ABOUT THE VIAL OF LIFE?

The Vial of Life is an emergency preparedness program that allows citizens to compile personal information so that it is readily available for 9-1-1 responders in the event of an emergency. The Vial of Life looks like a prescription pill bottle, but contains an individual's health information including the name and contact information of a primary medical provider, existing health conditions, allergies, and medications the individual might take. Once completed, the sheet is placed in the Vial and stored on the top shelf of the refrigerator door. A magnet that is provided with the Vial is then placed on the upper right corner of the refrigerator door to alert emergency personnel that the household participates in the program. In the event of an emergency, the Vial could be life-saving by providing emergency personnel with a brief medical history that can help them respond and treat more effectively in a time of crisis.
