**Construction Near Skyline Trail.
Enjoy Nature, *but Be Cautious!***

CORONA STREETS NEED RELIEF

As the City of Corona's population continues to rise, traffic demands are also on the incline. In an effort to bring traffic relief to congested surface streets, the City studied, planned, designed and is now constructing a road extension project: **Foothill Parkway Westerly Extension Project** (Foothill Project). The two-mile extension traverses between Trudy Way to Paseo Grande at Green River Road along the northern boundary of the Cleveland National Forest. When construction begins, there will be a lot of moving elements that visitors, hikers, bicyclists and residents will need to pay close attention to.

PROJECT OFFICE AREA: DO NOT ENTER!

The Project Team set up their offices and staging area at the end of Foothill Parkway at the cul-de-sac. This area is a **hard hat zone**. It is gated and restricted from public access for one primary reason: your safety! Large machines, vehicles and equipment are constantly moving in and out of this area. Skyline visitors and residents are to avoid this area at all times for the duration of the project (approximately 2 years).



NATURE HAS A NEW NEIGHBOR: Construction

Safety is of the utmost importance to the City and the Project Team. This large-scale project is in very close proximity to the Skyline Trail and other trails. It is imperative that all visitors obey posted signage and stay out of the identified construction zones. *Please do not deviate from recognized trails or enter any of the construction areas.*
